## Township may be forced to update radio system

A new regulation by the Federal Communications Commission may force Ross Township to update its hand-held radio system.

During Tuesday night's supervisors meeting, Chairman Stan Davis said a new law from the FCC requires municipalities to convert all radio frequencies to narrow ban by October 2011.

Davis said the move would create more frequencies by condensing the current users, he said.

The next meeting of the Ross Township supervisors will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, April 12 in the municipal building.

Currently, the township has nine mobile radios and three portables. Davis was unsure how many would need to be replaced and how many could be reprogrammed.

"Anything older than three years will probably need to be replaced,"

Supervisors budgeted a small tion of replacing some of the radios this year. Davis said estimates will be sought once a list of units that need to be replaced is made.
