DMS scientists take third place

Dallas Middle School finished in third place in the Pennsylvania Northeast Regional Science Olympiad at Penn State/Wilkes-Barre. The event was under the direction of Daniel Blessner, lecturer of physics, and Karen Brace-Hodde, external relations assistant, at Penn State Wilkes-Barre.

More than 750 students from 52 schools in northeastern and central Pennsylvania competed in 36 individual and team events, including Bottle Rocket, Disease Detective, Forensics, Junkyard Challenge, and Mousetrap Vehicle.

The Science Olympiad is devoted to increasing student interest in science, recognizing outstanding achievement and improving the quality of science education.

First-place winner in the Middle School division was JT Lamber Intermediate School while second-place honors went to Wyoming Area Middle School.

Athens Area High School was the first-place winner in the High School Division while Wyoming Area High School placed second and Nanticoke High School finished third.

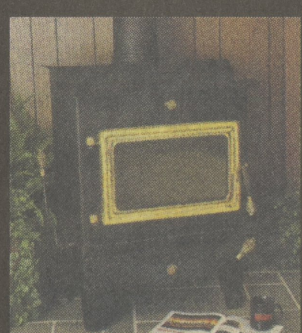

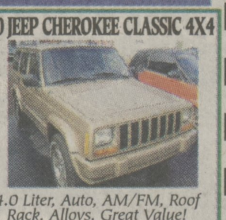
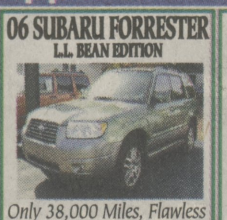
