The American Red Cross Community Chapters of Susquehanna County and Wyoming County have united to become one.

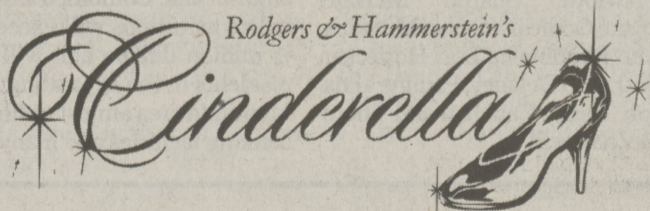
Effective April 1, the name for the newly-formed bi-county community chapter is The Susquehanna and Wyoming Counties Chapter of the American Red Cross.
