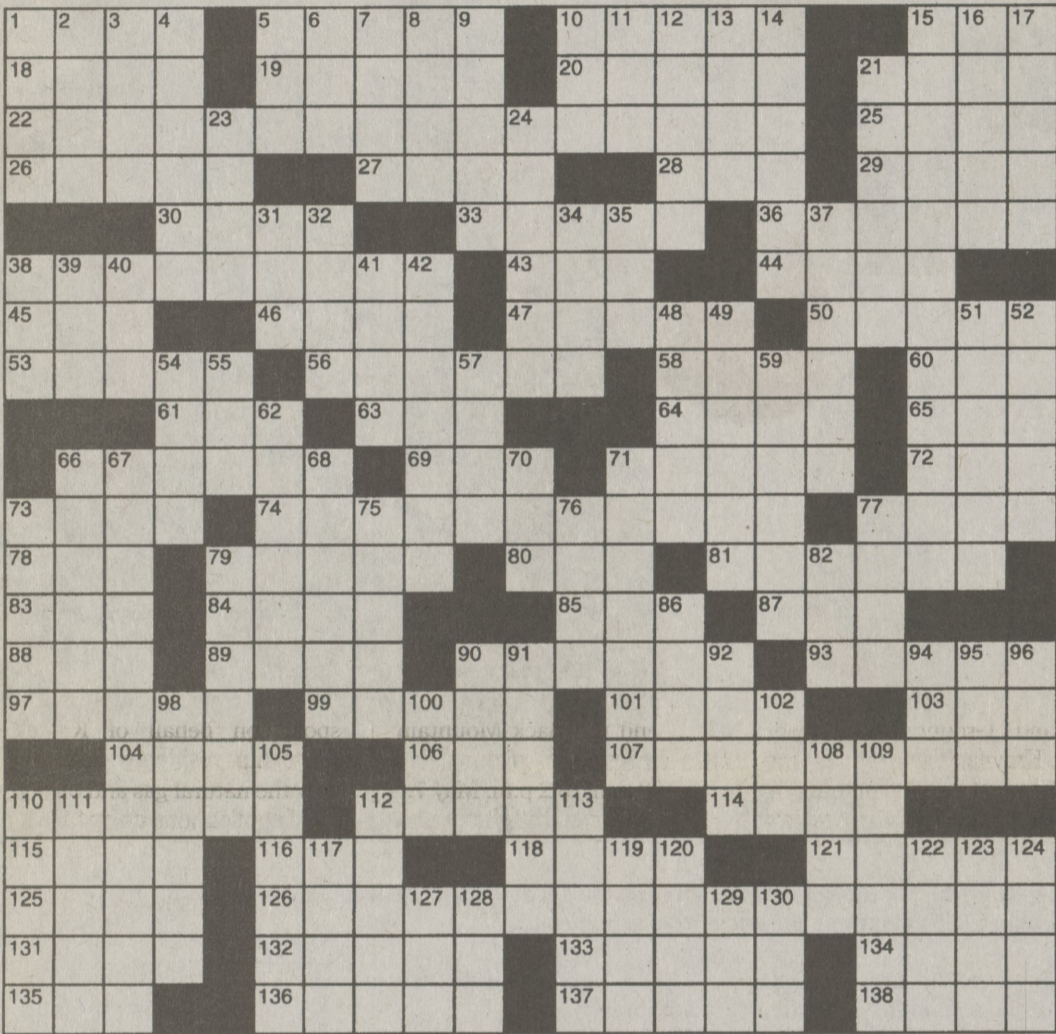

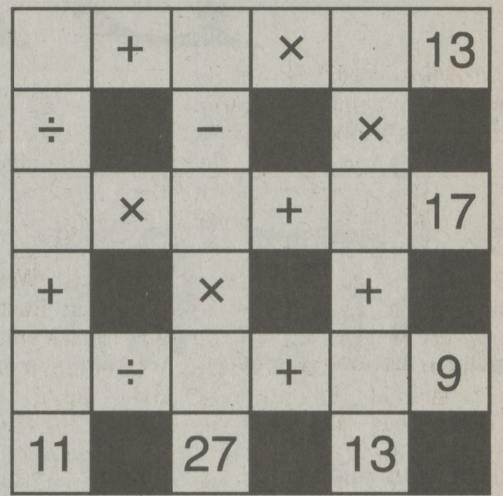

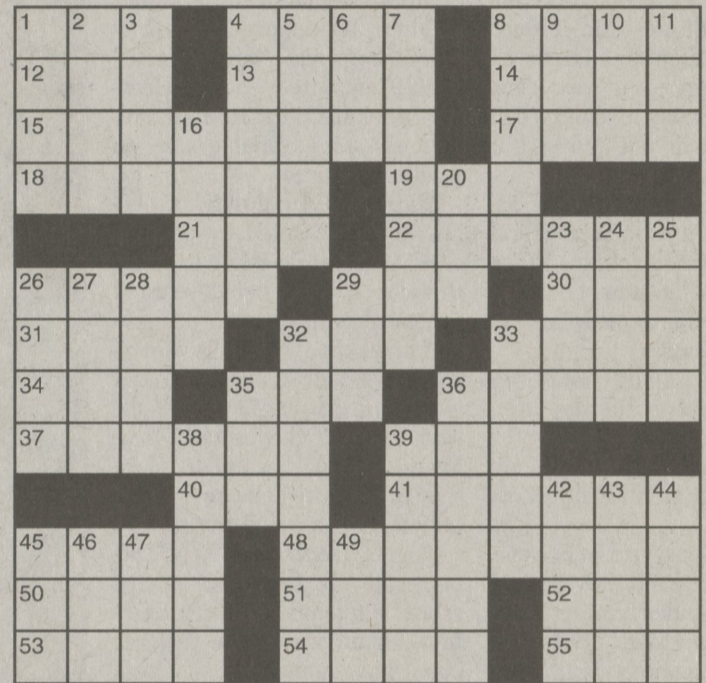

Candidates vying for Wyoming County commissioner in the May 17 primary have been invited to a "Meet the Candidates Night" at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 4 at Shadowbrook Resort.

Candidates will have up to one minute to make opening remarks about why they want to be county commissioner and then will be given an opportunity to respond to questions submitted by those in attendance. The five Republicans vying for the office of Wyoming County Commissioner are incumbent Judy Kraft Mead and challengers Michael Distadio, Tom Henry, Connie Kintner and Sandra Ritz.

The three Democrats seeking the position are incumbent Stark Bartron and challengers Richard Dixon and Ron Williams.

Incumbent Tony Litwin has decided not to seek re-election.

Procter & Gamble spokesman Alex Fried will serve as moderator for the evening. The event is open to the public at no charge.
