Private 1st Class Edward P. Friar served with the U.S. Army during WW2. He fought in the North African Campaign and the invasion of Sicily. He was the recipient of the Purple Heart and two battle stars. Sponsored by the Friar and **Kross families**



Sergeant Jack Evans, assigned Lt. Colonel Ronald P. Fitch Jr. to C Company 502 Parachute Infantry of the 101st Airborne Division during WW II, was one of just three men from his original company of 89 soldiers to survive. Frederick "Ted" Loveland served with the U.S. Army during WW2. At the age of 27, he was killed in action in France while serving with an infantry regiment. Sponsored by the **Griffith and Roberts families**



Corporal Raymond Loveland served in the U.S. Army during WW2. He died at the age of 20 in the service of his country from a leg injury that occurred during maneuvers. His death in 1944 was the second serviceman death in recent months, for the Loveland Family. Sponsored by the Griffith and Roberts families

Sergeant Todd Mark, serving with the U.S. Army, has served six tours of duty in the Iraq Afghanisgan battle area. Sponsored by the Logue family
