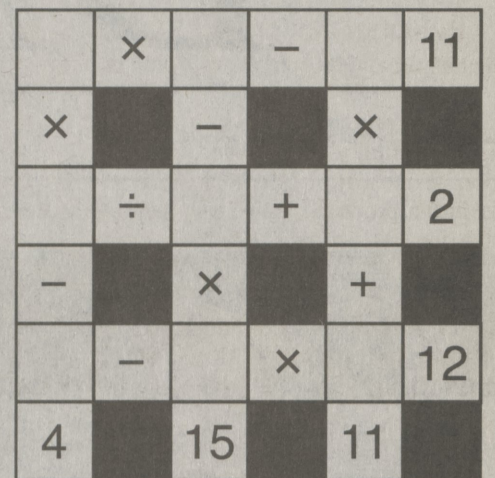

'Hamlet' is featured at 'Shakespeare in the Park'

For the fourth year in a row, the Dietrich Theater in downtown Tunkhannock will present "Shakespeare in the Park" when "Hamlet" comes to life at 7 p.m. on Saturday, June 25 in Tunkhannock's scenic Riverside Park. Performed by five actors of the Gamut Theatre Group of Harrisburg, audience members will be able to experience an 80-minute version of Shakespeare's original text. Hamlet is considered to be one of the most powerful and influential plays in the English language. In this story, Hamlet, a prince, is distraught by the hasty marriage of his Uncle Claudius to his newly-widowed mother.

The ghost of Hamlet's father visits his son, reveals that he was murdered by Claudius and entreats Hamlet to set things right. Shaken, Hamlet devises a complex plan to prove Claudius' guilt, but the choices he makes result in multiple tragedies. Shakespeare's Hamlet contemplates the age-old question: "To be, or not to be?" and the play also examines the difference between what an individual seems to be and what he or she really is.
