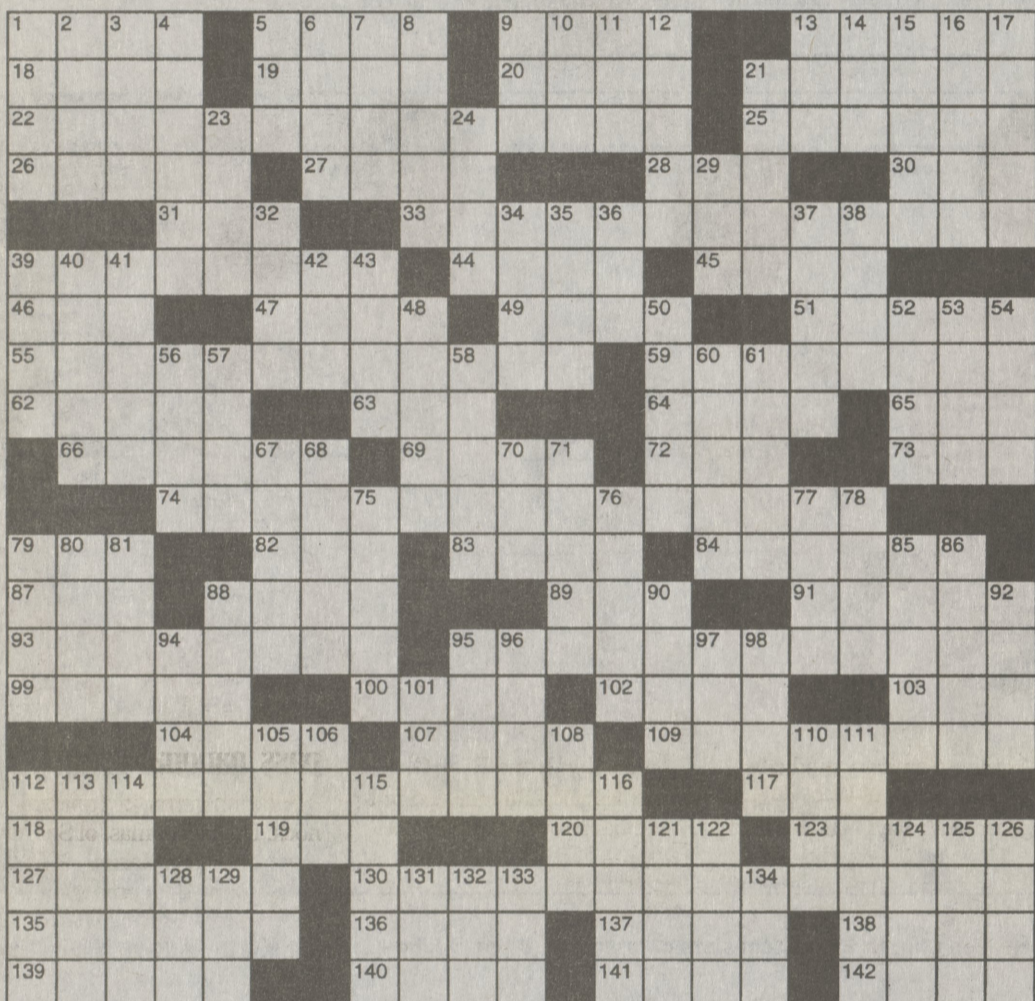

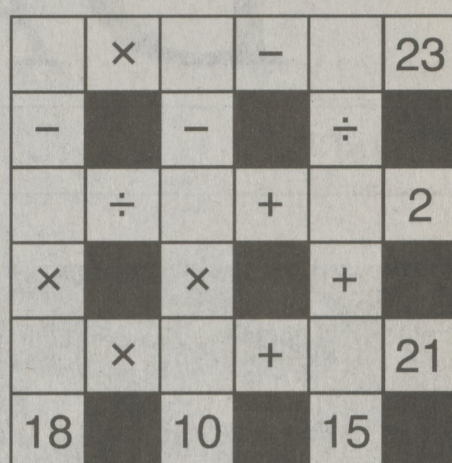

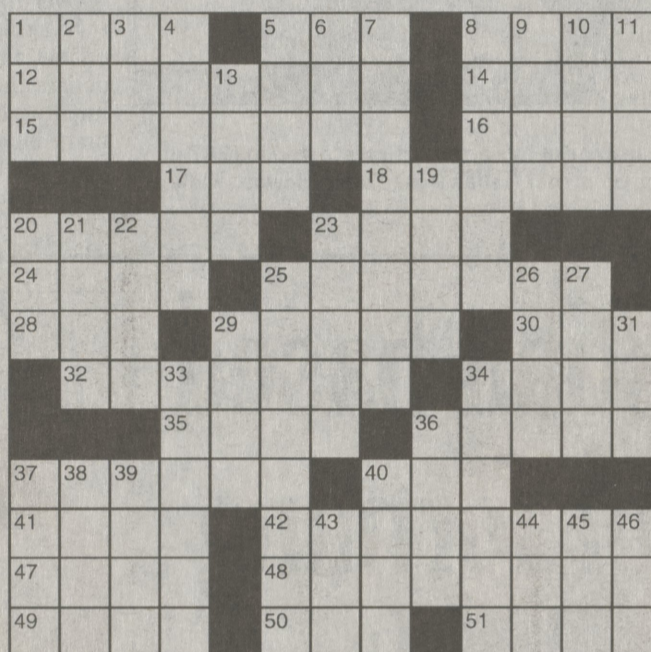

Philharmonic headlines Fourth of July concert

The Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic will perform a concert at 7:45 p.m. on Monday, July 4 at Kirby Park in downtown Wilkes-Barre. The performance, which will mark the 31st year of the Fourth of July Philharmonic Concert, will be followed by a fireworks display.

This performance is again being sponsored by The Martz Group, a 31-year supporter of the Philharmonic and of the annual Independence Day Concert in Kirby Park.

Both performances will feature patriotic songs such as the Armed Forces Salute, Liberty Bell March, Stars & Strips along with some Broadway and movie favorites. The concerts will close with the tradi-

tional Overture 1812. Conducting the orchestra for the performances will be guest conductor Joan Landry as Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic Music Director Lawrence Loh is currently on tour in Europe conducting the PSO Youth Orchestra.

Landry made her debut with the National Symphony at the Carter Barron Amphitheater in 2004. The next summer she appeared with Marvin Hamlisch and the National Symphony at Wolf Trap for a tribute to Cole Porter. She has also served as cover conductor of the National Symphony for three seasons after attending its National Conductor's Institute in 2002.
