 In other news, the board...
 • Approved an ordinance setting regulations on public amusements and exhibitions within the township. Reino said parties that would be affected by this ordinance, including representatives from The Lands at Hillside Farms and Back Mountain Harvest Assembly, helped in the process of revising the ordinance.
 • Approved an ordinance to amend the police pension plan to comply with the Pension Pro-

tection Act of 2006 and the Heroes Earnings Assistance and Relief Tax Act of 2008.
 • Authorized the township manager to write a letter to state officials opposing a proposed state House Bill that would deem the township's natural gas and oil ordinance invalid.
 • Authorized the township manager to contact PennDOT and request a traffic study for the placement of a "restricted hours" sign at the intersection of State Route 309 and Hillside Road. Reino said the owner of an auto garage across the street from the intersection inquired about the sign because the restrictions cause motorists to turn around in his garage's park-

ing lot.
 • Authorized the township manager to seek letters of interest to fill the vacancy left by the unexpected death of zoning hearing board member Ben Go-rey.
 • Approved the cooperative purchase of a laptop computer and insurance not to exceed \$400 in accordance with operation of a speed trailer purchased jointly by members of the Back Mountain Community Partnership.
 • The next public work session will be held at 7 p.m. on Monday, Dec. 12 and the next regular meeting will be held at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 14 in the municipal building.

two of them, Kehler and Kelly, were elected to council.
 Boice served on council from 1979-81 and her husband, Richard Boice, served as mayor for several years. She decided to jump back into local government because of increased natural gas development throughout the state and said she hopes to reintroduce an anti-gas drilling ordinance struck down by council last year in an attempt to protect the water quality in the borough.
 "We need to ban it from the community," she said. "Zoning isn't going to save us."
 Williams was the Republican candidate who earned a seat with the second-highest amount of votes, 382. Her husband, Rich, is one council member whose seat was up for grabs in Tuesday's election.
 Attempts to reach Amy Williams for comment on the election result were unsuccessful.
 Harveys Lake resident Mark Whitesell was interested in the local race because he felt the issue at hand was fiscal responsibility in the borough.
 "With the council we have now, this is the first time we've been in a deficit," he said. "I'm a Republican and we have a Republican council, but I think it's about budget adherence."
 Frank Pinkerton, of Harveys Lake, agreed.
 "We have a slight financial problem here," he said. "If you don't vote, you can't complain."
KINGSTON TOWNSHIP
 In Kingston Township, incumbent supervisor James Reino Jr. and current Dallas School Board member Gary Mathers won two of three open seats on the board

of supervisors.
 A third seat, left vacant by current supervisor John Solinsky who dropped out of the race, will be filled by a write-in candidate.
 Officials said no write-in campaign had been waged in the township prior to Election Day, and the write-in results were unavailable at press time.
