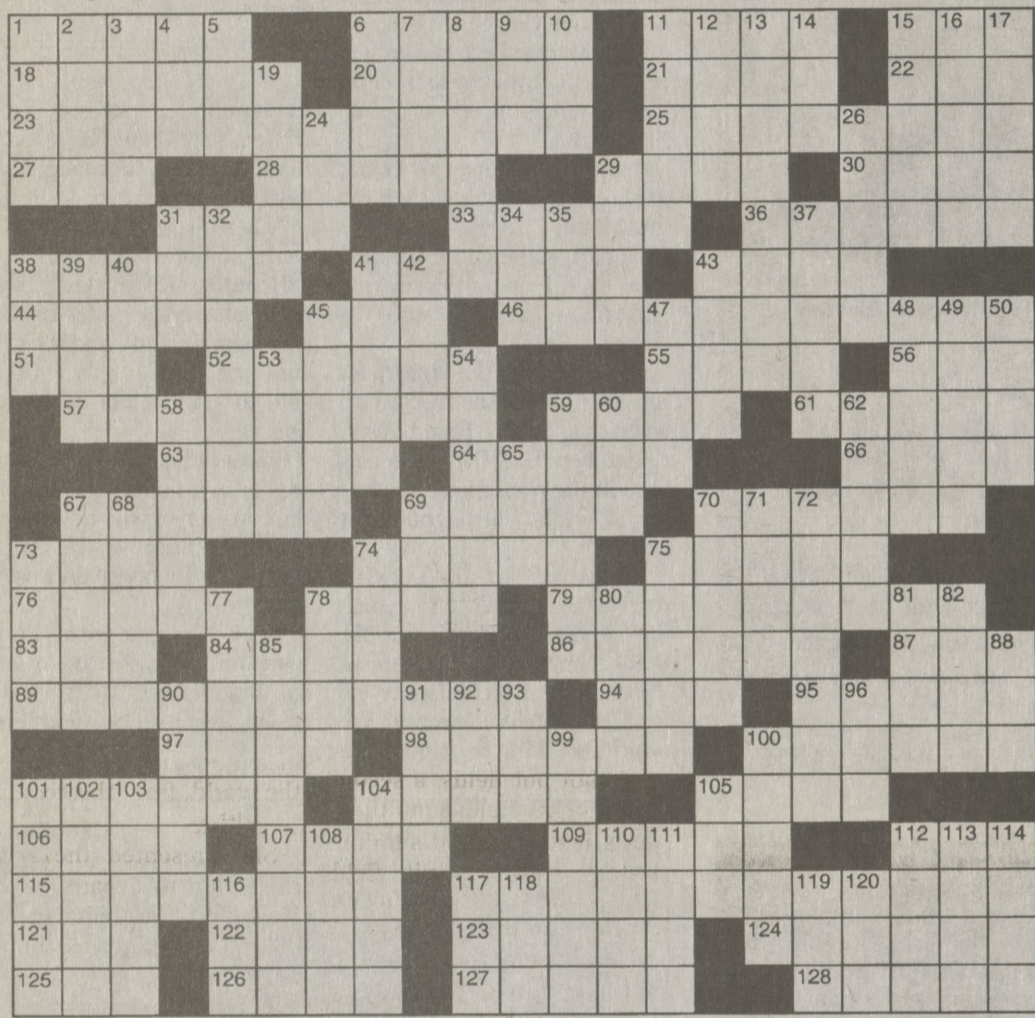

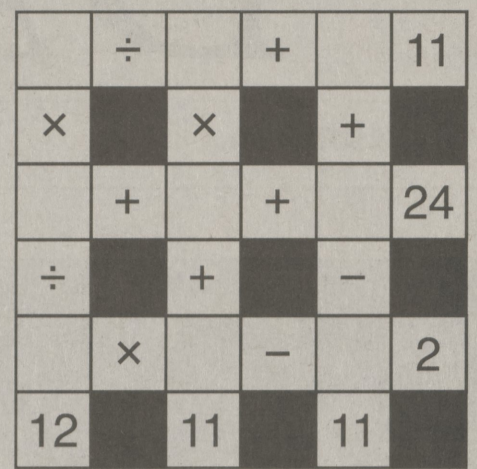

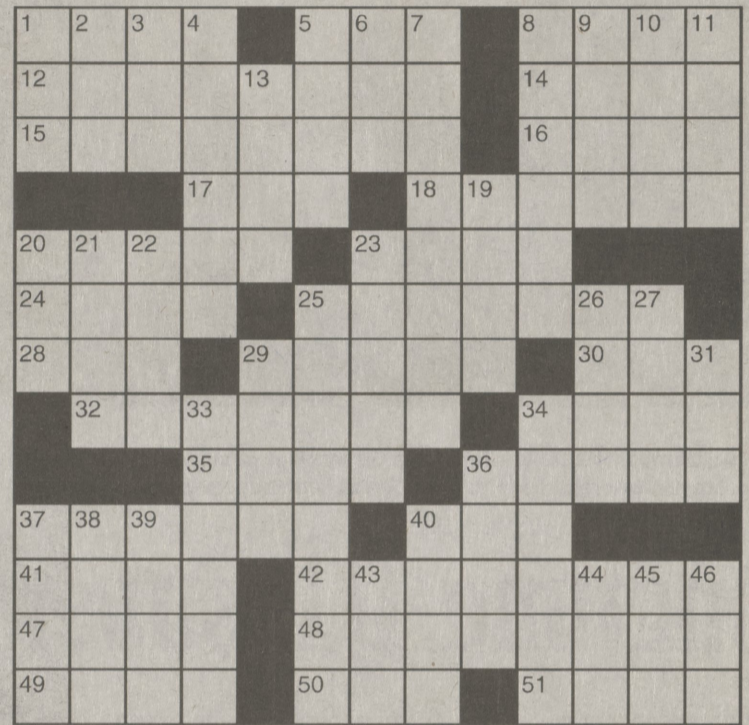

Wyoming County receives recycling grant

Reps. Sandra Major (R-Susquehanna/Wayne/Wyoming) and Karen Boback (R-Columbia/Luzerne/Wyoming) have announced a Recycling Performance Grant in the amount of \$4,233 for Wyoming County.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) awards Recycling Performance Grants in addition to funds it allocates to help communities establish and maintain recycling programs.

Grant amounts are based on population and the total

amount of recycled material. Wyoming County salvaged 563.7 tons in 2009, which could have ended up in a landfill.
