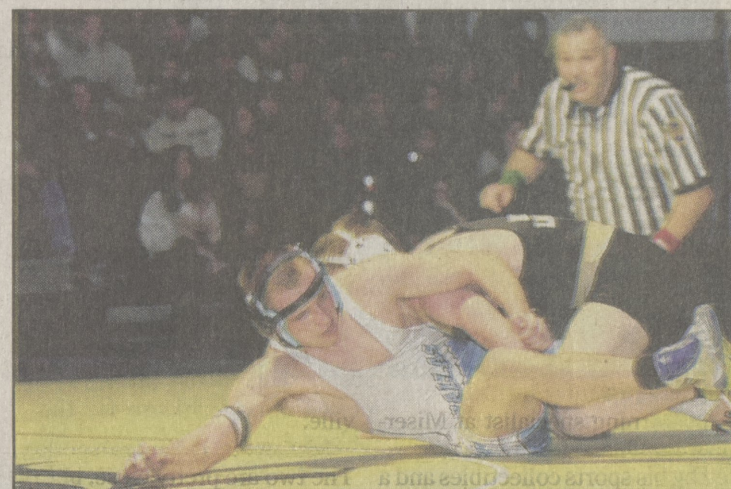


Zach Macosky of Dallas is held in check by Lake-Lehman's Jake Winters in the 145 lb. bracket.

## Youths win Knights Free Throw Championship

Four boys and one girl from the Back Mountain area were named local winners of the 2012 Father O'Leary Knights of Columbus #8224 Free Throw Championship, earning the right to compete at the district level in February.

The Back Mountain Knights of Columbus sponsored the local competition at the Gate of Heaven School gymnasium. All area youngsters ages 10 to 14 were eligible to participate.
