McGovern.

He said there's a two-year waiting list for enrollment in Hildebrandt's programs, and McGovern feels this will allow the 70student capacity facility to fill quickly.

McGovern hopes the facility will not only create additional funds for the district - he's hoping it will net between \$70,000 and \$100,000 annually – but will also save money in other ways.

"If I could preserve one or two teaching positions based on the fact we have a daycare, I think it's ell worth it," he said. "...Every ar, maybe there are people who stay out longer on FMLA (Family Medical Leave Act) that would come back sooner if they believe their children are here at work with them. Plus, the quality of education increases because you're going to preserve the continuity of that same teacher in the classroom for greater periods of time." He hopes the facility will also
