All tickets for this show-only performance will be \$8. There will be a 10:30 a.m. performance on Friday, Aug. 24 for summer camps and daycare centers.

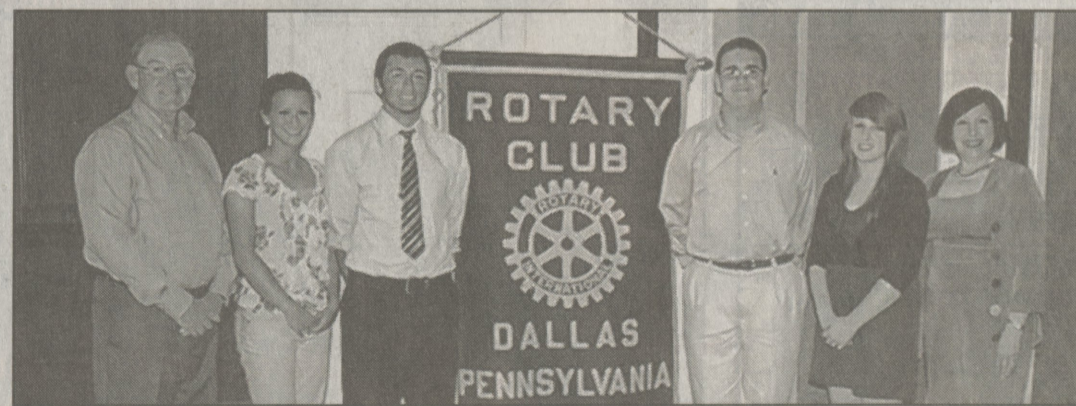
