# Misericordia's 'Voices' project will air on WVIA-TV

Misericordia University's "The Voices Project: Disability," a poignant staged reading of memoirs that promotes understanding and examines the stereotypes and prejudices faced by those living with disabilities, debuted on WVIA-TV on Nov. 19.

The television program will be rebroadcast at 3 p.m. today, Nov. 25 and at 7 p.m. on Monday, Dec. 10 at 7 p.m.

The hour-long program is based on interviews done by students in the Introduction to Psychology class of Associate Professor Alicia Nordstrom, Ph.D.


