# Despite changes, this place is still comfortable and relaxing

The first thing one sees when walking in the tall front doors of Metro Bar and Grill in the Twin Stacks Center, Dallas, is the bar at the front of the room, its long wooden counter leading to a diverse selection of beer taps at the far end.

Tables dot the center of the floor and booths line the walls, both downstairs and in the loft. A maze of piping and metal fixtures hangs overhead, reminiscent of the building's days as a textile mill.

The setting brings a

casual and nostalgic flare to the atmosphere of the establishment, which the owner, Tom Ford, 57, of Mount Pocono, describes as "a slightly upscale, fun, casual place with very good food and an excellent beer and wine selection."

"I think that (the decor and history of the location) adds to the uniqueness of the place," Ford said. "That, and in addition, we're not just a nice place to look at, but a place where you can comfortably and reliably take family and friends
