

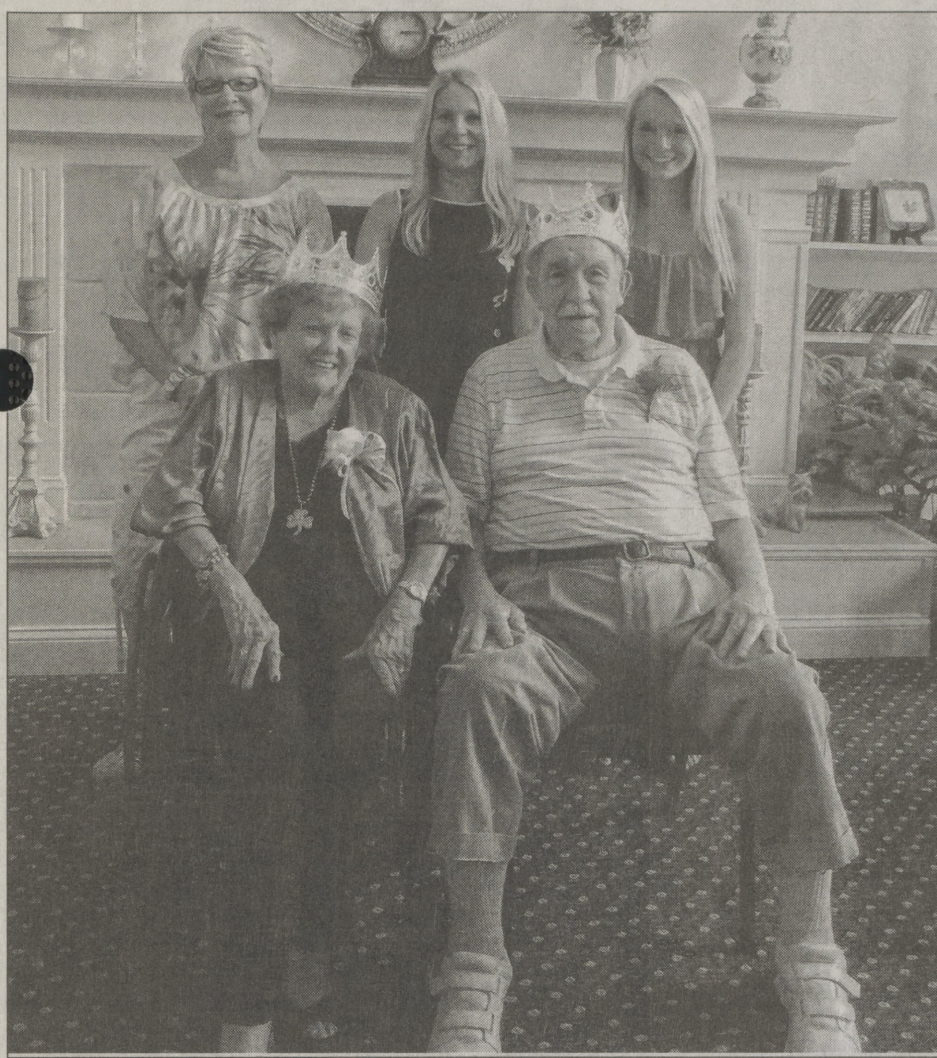
Five Dallas High School seniors recognized by Youth Salute
