## Mom and Pop shop keeps main street America alive in Dallas

With its creaky hardood floors, tightlyacked shelving and friendly greetings from the owners and small staff, Dallas Centre Hardware at 42-44 Main S. in Dallas is a classic "mom and pop shop," a rarity found today in only a handful of small American towns, according to co-owner Gerard Geise, of Shavertown.

Geise and his wife, Michele, acquired the store about five years ago from Michele's parents, Jim and Carol Eason, who still reside in the Back Mountain, but spend the colder months in Florida. The Easons opened the store in 1981 when Michele was 14 years ago. She spoke of her father as an extremely dedicated and a hard worker.

"He pretty much started with everything on his own," she said.
