Paving in Dallas Borough

United Water Pennsylvania is in the process of completing or has recently completed water main installation projects on Franklin Street and Pinecrest Avenue in Dallas Borough.

Dallas Borough Road Department plans to complete overlay pavement on Franklin Street and Pinecrest Avenue in the spring of 2014 in order to adhere to the recommended post-construction waiting period and in light of the unavoidable cold weather limitations.

Once a borough road has

will not approve any utility pave cuts (other than for emergencies under the roadway) for a period of up to five years.

Should residents be considering the installation of water, gas or other utility repairs or improvements, they are advised that any and all utility cuts to the roadway will be required to be completed prior to the street resurfacing project and then prohibited for the five-year moratorium noted above.
