Chemical Generator for Hot Water. It has been shown that a certain combination of saits brings about the generation of heat. By applying this chemical phenomenon a cheap and efficient warming bottle may be formed, writes S. Leonard Bastin in the Popular Science Monthly.

First of all, mix together sodium acetate and sodium hyposulphate in water, using one part of the former to nine parts of the latter salt. There should be a sufficient quantity of these materials to fill the earthenware bottle three parts full. The vessel should now be loosely stoppered and placed either in hot water or in an oven until the

salts have completely dissolved. For many hours after this the bottle good shaking.




