EDITORIAL.

OUR ANCIENT HISTORY.

In the series of descriptions of the Hotels of Milford now being published in the Press, we simlpy desire to rescue from oblivion such facts relating to their early history as may yet be within the recollection of some of the older people. This information, while perhaps possessing no great historical value, is of much local interest, and we should feel under many obligations if those who have knowledge of well authenticated facts will make them known so they may be incorporated in the proper place. The boundary between the present and past, so far as the memory of those who were then active is concerned, is fast becoming an insuperable barrier, and the twilight of seventy years ago is rapidly fading into impenetrable 188 Wyckoff, Peter darkness. If the old people would in give their recollection of early scenes, events, and persons, they would add much to the information and interest of our early local history and confer a boon on the present and coming 148 generations. In many other towns the newspapers published in early days furnish a great amount of local matter, and in Milford the first paper appears to have been published in June 1827. (We have a copy of Vol. 1, No. 38, dated March 8, 1828, printed for the proprietor by T. A. Wells) but it does not contain a single local or personal item. If the old people would amuse themselves in their leisure moments by jotting down their recollection of early associates and people, and the location of buildings and occupants, with such anecdotes, or other matter, as throw light on past events, giving dates as nearly as may be, it serve an excellent purpose, and be highly appreciated not only by their families but the community generally, and by receiving proper credit in the publication they would erect, for themselves a monument more enduring than brass.
