#### EDITORIAL.

COUNTY COLLECTORS.

IT MAY seem early to discuss the question of tax collection, inasmuch as the Legislature will not meet in several months, and any change could not be made effective until that body was in session, to pass the necessary laws, but it may be well to begin now, in order that if there is any general dissatisfaction with the present method, the matter may be considered in ample time. In this county it is becoming difficult to find men to serve in that capacity. The bonds required, while not excessive in amount, are annoying to obtain, and the compensation, while as great as should be paid, is yet wholly inadequate to compensate a Collector for the care, trouble and labor required if he properly fulfills the duties of the office. The County Treasurer is required to give a bond sufficient to cover all the taxes and other moneys received | 85 Wykon, Isane the taxes and other moneys received | 76 Yohe, Adam by him, and the Collectors are in part compelled to give bonds for the same money. Then, too, the time same money. Then, too, the time fixed for payment, in order to give the farmers the benefit of the rebate, is most inopportune for them, coming at a time when they have little to sell, and are at the greatest expense in the way of gathering their crops.
