I also hereby make known and give notice that the places of holding the aforesaid general election in the several districts within the County of Pike are as follows, to wit:

The electors of the township of Blooming Grove to meet at the house of Moses C. Westbrook in said township.

That it is provided by an Act of Assembly approved June 19, 1891, and the amendments and supplements thereto: "That every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States, or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, who is or shall be employed under the Legislative, Executive, or Judiciary Department of this State, or of the United States, or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city or commissioners of any incorporated district, is, by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for except that of an election officer."
