A MENDMENT TO THE CONSTITU MONWEALTH, IN PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE XVIII OF THE CONSTITUTION.

A JOINT RESOLUTION Proposing at amendment to the Canaditation of the Commonwealth.
Section 1. He it resolved by the Senatand House of Representatives of the Commonwealth in General Assembly met. That the following is proposed as an enducrate to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with the provisions of the lighteenth article thereof.

Section 7 Uniformity of Election Laws,—All laws regulating at beletions by the citizens or for the registration of electors shall be uniform throughout the Saste, but laws regulating and requiring the testimation of electors may be enacted to apply to eitles only, provided that such laws be uniform for cities of the same class.
