POLICY PLAYING.

The crusade in Philadelphia against policy selling and the investigation by Judge Finletter in which it was shown that school children habitually bought policy may have the effect of informing the police department of that model city that there are such iniquities in existence. It was not shown by legal proof that the officers connived at the evil or prevented prosecutions, but what is a police force for if not to ferret out crime and arrest offenders, and if officials are not able to do so it is time there was an overhauling.

The public will not exonerate officers of the law because it cannot be positively shown by direct proof that they are culpable. The very fact that such things cannot be proven only shows their adoption in slinking their duty without being caught.

AUDITORS FEES.

Notice is given that an act will be introduced in the legislature to repeal the special Act of 1865 for Pike Co. so far as it fixes the fees of Auditors. That act gives the county Auditors \$3 a day for 8 days and for all time spent over 8 days the compensation now allowed by law which by the act of 1864 is \$2 a day.

The repeal of the act of 1865 will fix the compensation according to the act of 1887 which allows \$3 a day and 6 cents per mile circular from and to their houses once for every week while so employed. This will increase the compensation considerably.

Senators and Representatives who have called at the White House in the interests of constituents who seek commissions in the Army, under the Re-organization Act, have been very plainly informed by the President that so far as it is possible to do so, these appointments will be given to the officers and men who have served with the volunteers in the Philippines. This position is such a just one that nobody has uttered one word of protest against it.

Before giving up his seat to Senator Clapp, elected by the Republican Legislature of Minnesota to succeed the late Senator Davis, Senator Towner, the Demo-pop, who held the seat a few weeks by gubernatorial appointment, made a political speech in which all the is as condemned by the majority of the voters in the late campaign, were exploited. A resolution for the independence of the Philippines was made the text for the wall of woe.

In sentencing McAllister, Campbell and Death to thirty years in the penitentiary and Kerr to fifteen for their connection with the death of Jennie Boscheiter in Paterson Judge Dixon only meted out justice. Such soundings are safer within prison walls and society breathes easier to know it. Besides such sentences may deter other evil doers.

The difficulty experienced in several states and the scandals connected with the election of United States Senators should go far toward changing the methods of their selection. There can be no doubt but that election by the people direct would be more satisfactory.

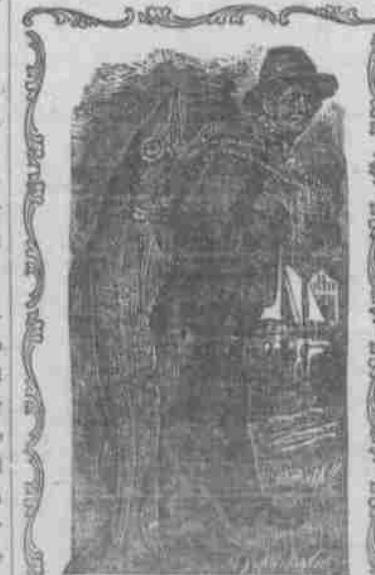
