Senator Lodge is to be made obairman of the senate committee on foreign relations as soon as the next session of congress opens, and will at once move for the abrogation of the Clayton Balwer treaty. That is the sum and substance of current gossip among prominent republicans, and if that programme is carried out it will necessarily bring the Isthmian canal question to an immediate issue in congress. The chairmanship of the senate foreign relations committee has been vacant since the death of Senator Davis. Senator Frye has been acting chairman and as the senior republican on the committee would become chair-


