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

The few pairs of pigeons brought 100 years ago from Venice to Vienna have ultiplied to such an amazing extent as to have become a public pest. There is great difficulty in exterminating these pretty creatures, as, besides the danger involved to the public in shooting them, many of the birds would per haps only be wounded.
