RUINED CITY OF COPAN.

Work of Exeavation by Selentists on Prehistoric Remains Stopped by Hundayas Government.

All work on the ruins of the great prehistoric city of Copan, in Hondurns, has been suspended by order of the Honduras government. Extensive ex-cavations have been made at Copan by agents of the Peabody exploration fund, and great palaces and temples, giant stalrways and broad plazas have been unearthed. Enough was uncov-ered to show that Copan was the capital of a great empire, says the Philadelphia Press.

The government of Honduras gave no valid reason for stopping the exca-vations, and the custodians of the Peabody exploration fund hope to be able to get permission to resume work next year, as the prohibition seems to be only the result of a temporary fresh on the part of the native officials. Meantime a wall has been built around a part of the city and watchmen, living in buts amid the roined palaces of for gotten kings, keep away natives who might deface and destroy the elaborate stone carvings and sculptures,
