### THE GIST OF THE BIBLE

A course of lessons in Bible study conducted by Rev. V. A. Wood on Monday evenings at the Methodist Parsonage.

### LESSON VIII

DIVISION 1. Get the gist of the first 15 chapters of Exodus and answer the following questions concerning the same: In what capacity did the Israelites serve the Egyptians? Were they well treated? What order from Pharaoh concerning the male children? Who was saved and how? For what purpose? Give main events in life of Moses until the Lord sent him to Pharaoh. Who was Aaron? What demand was made on Pharaoh? What proof that God had sent Moses? How could the Egyptians imitate these miracles? Name the plagues that came upon the land. What last plague might also have affected the Israelites? How averted? What memorial instituted? Describe the departure of the Israelites. How did God manifest His presence? What event at the Red Sea? Discuss the phenomena of the sea being beaten back.

DIVISION 2. Read Matt. 8: 5-13, Luke 7: 11-35, Matt. 11: 20-30 and Luke 7: 36-50 in order given. CENTURION'S SERVANT HEALED. How did this man show faith? What remark of Jesus concerning his faith? In v 12 who are the "children of the kingdom"? (of Matt. 21: 43.) Does he intimate that some who expect to be saved will be lost? SON OF WIDOW RAISED. What prompted the miracle? What conclusion did the witnesses reach? CHRIST'S REPLY TO JOHN. What two kinds of evidences did Christ offer concerning his Messiahship? REMARKS ABOUT JOHN. Why did the publicans accept John's teaching and the Pharisees reject it? WARNING TO CHORAZIN AND CAPERNAUM. These cities were very sinful. Why? MARY MAGDALENE. With what parable did Jesus condemn Simon? How commend Mary? Why forgives her?

DIVISION 3. Read Rom. 15 and 16. What limitations to "doing as we please"? v 1, 2. Why? v 3. (of Mark 10: 43-45.) How does joy and peace come? v 13. "No more place" in v 23 refers to unevangelized territory. Note the extent of Paul's work. v 19. If Paul was twice imprisoned at Rome he may have visited Spain (v 24) between times. There is no evidence either way. How ought a contribution from Gentiles to Jews at Jerusalem (v 26) to affect both parties? Had Paul any fear that it might not be accepted? v 30, 31. Who wrote this Epistle? Paul usually employed an amanuensis, but wrote to the Galatians with his own hand. Gal. 6: 11. What impression have you received from the study of this Epistle concerning Paul's character, wisdom, labors, zeal, love?
