IMPORTANT FACTS

The Anti-Trust Laws Altogether the Work of Republicans

If the following statement of facts had originated in a republican newspaper they would probably be characterized by the democrats as political clap net gutter up for campaign purposes...

1. The anti-trust law was framed by a republican, was passed by a republican house and a republican senate, was signed by a republican president.

2. The law remained a dead letter on the statute books during the entire second term of Grover Cleveland, a democratic president.

3. The first effort to enforce the law was made by Theodore Roosevelt, a Republican president. The first attorney general to vigorously prosecute offenders and to test the law was a republican attorney general, Puffer O. Knox.

A Non-Partisan Measure to Protect Government Timber Lands

A sharp fight marked the opening of the campaign in Congress to secure the passage of the Quarles bill which provides for the re-appointment of the timber and stone act.

SEEDLESS APPLES DEVELOPED

Look Like Naval Oranges and Grow on Blossomless Trees

After experimenting for seven years, John V. Spencer, an old fruit grower of Grand Junction, Col., has succeeded in perfecting a seedless apple.

The apple looks like a naval orange. Its inside is entirely solid and there is a depression in the navel end very similar to that of the seedless orange.

Spencer is preparing to graft his seedless buds on every sort of apple tree, and asserts that he will be able to develop seedless apples on every variety.

The trees on which the seedless fruit grows is unusual in that it has no blossoms.
