

The regival of the guillotine in France, the most enlightened of all European countries, recalls the fact that "barbaric" Russia, of all governments in the world, was the first to

abolish the death penalty.

The great Catharine was moved to this step by reading Beccaria's cele-brated wors, "Criminals and Punishments." Ever since the appearance of that book Russia punishes even the vitest of crimes with imprisonment and bankament only. Her bullets and sups are exclusively for political offenders or suspects.
