Boys cannot be crowded into a hard and fast mold of virtue; they must be patiently guided and controlled. The responsibility for the care of all youth cannot be wholly delegated to their parents for obvious reasons.

Sunday schools have a place if they are energetic in reforming but they have little influence here. Night schools would not meet the emergency. We have no reading room no Y. M. C. A. and the only method which seems practical is to provide a place for boys to pass a few evenings each week and so take from them the excuse that they have no place to go but the streets.
