All candidates for examination, both teachers and pupils, should provide themselves with plenty of foolscap paper, pencils, pen and ink, and a scratch tablet.

All candidates for teacher's certificate who have not done the required professional reading, or its equivalent, will be refused a certificate.

All examinations, with the exception of the one at Lackawaxen, will begin promptly at 8 o'clock. Prompt attendance will be required under penalty of being excluded from the examinations.

A special examination will be held at Matamoras, August 27. School Directors and other interested parties are cordially invited to attend the examinations.

## Condition of Our Streets

After every rain it is more apparent that the shale used on our streets is not the proper material. A coating of crushed stone put on the streets to the mud would soon convert them to a hard surface impervious to water. We think it will be found that no oil or dust preventive will be satisfactory on the dirt streets of the borough. Shale is too soft and is constantly being ground into a dust, which no practical quantity of oil will lay. There is but one thing to do on roads subjected to as much wear as ours and that is give them a hard surface. It will cost more at first but will be great economy in the end.
