

Theological Seminary at Hagerstown, where he not only maintained, but extended his reputation as a friend, a scholar, and a Christian. He was afterwards licensed by the church to preach the Gospel, with the view of becoming an ordained minister, and Pastor of a Charge. But he now received overtures from the trustees of Westmoreland College, to become teacher in that Institution. No other post of 1857 having their present object, he gladly accepted the position, and as one who he could be eminently useful to the church. For more than two years he labored here with the greatest zeal and success. It was here at his post that he died, and it is here also where his loss will be deeply felt. He did not, however, confine his labors to the school, but whenever opportunity offered, he proclaimed to others the glorious Gospel, which he himself professed and enjoyed. The very last discourse he delivered was in the Reformed church of this place, from the words, "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong." We cannot close this notice of one so beloved by all, without remarking the great love and reverence he ever manifested for our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, rejoicing in Him, and all the hope of his own salvation, but regarding Him as the centre of all things, and the hope of the future. He had the greatest reverence also for the Holy Catholic church, the Christian Ministry, and all the divinely appointed means of grace. He was not, therefore, the undoubted evidence to believe that he is only transferred from the church militant on earth to the church triumphant in heaven? Let me die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his!"
