Be it resolved by the Senate and Honse of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, I hat the lonowing Amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Coinmonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the

tenth article thereof: There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section lour, as follo as:

SECTION 4. Whenever any of the qualified elecvors of this Commonwealth snall be in any actual military service, under a requisition from the Presisent of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffrage in all elections by the catizen , under such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usu-

There shall be two additional sections to the eteventh article of the Consutution, to be designated as semious eight, and time, as follows: Secrion 8. No bill small be passed by the Logis-

lature, containing more than one subject, which snall be clearly expressed in the title, except appro Printion bills SECTION 9. No hill shall be passed by the Legis lature granting any powers, or privileges, in any
