* Be it resolved by the Senate and Hause of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following Amendments to proposed to the Communication of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the

tenth article thereof:

There shall be an additional section to the third article of the Constitution, so be designated as section to its fellows:

Nation 4: Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Communication shall be in any actual multary service, under a requisition from the Presilent of the United States, or by, the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of suffage in all elections by the citizen, un-der such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their uni-

I here shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight, and nine, as follows:

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legis-

lature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appro pnation bills SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or
