A Joint Besolution propositig certain Amendments to the Constitution.

Be it resolved by the Senute and Hanse of Representatives of the Commonlinealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met; Phat the following Amendments we proposed to the Communication of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof:

There shall be en additional section to the third article of the Constitution, to be designated as section four; is follows:

Section 4. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military service, under a requisition from the Presilent of the United States, or by the authority, of this Commonwealth; such electors may exercise the right of suffy regim all elections by the citizen authority of densuch reginations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usu-

Prince of election.

There shall be two additional sections to the elections. leventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight, and nine, as follows:
SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legis lature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legis lature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers, or privileg s, has been, or may bereafter be, conferred puon the courts of this Commonwealth JOHN CESSNA.
