A Joint Resolution proposing certain Amendments in the Constitution.

Be it resolved by the Senate and Hanse of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met. That the following Amendments we proposed to the Construction of the Comnonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof:

There whall be an additional section to the third pricle of the Constitution, to be designated as section tour, as follows:

Section 4. Whenever any of the qualified elecare of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual
military service, under a requisition from the Presilent of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exercise the right of surprise in all elections by the citizens, under such regulations as are, or shall be, prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their usu-

al place of ejection.
There shall be two additional acctions to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated

as sections eight, and nine, as follows:

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legis. lature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the utle, except appro priation bills Skerron 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legis
