These Machines are warranted to do the above and other machines in use.

Grain having much light chaff in it cleaned on this Machine is worth from 2 to 3 cents more per bushel than when cleaned on any other separator, or the common way of cleaning on hand fans. For this reason there is not the eighth part of light matter in the grain as when cleaned on the riddle principle. The best wheat freely on the grain as it leaves the chaff, whereas, when cleaned with riddle that advantage is lost.

This Machine does not return the tailings as most of the separators do. By returning filthy tailings alternately it is impossible to make merchantable grain. Another important feature in this machine that others of the kind have not, is the Self-acting Blast Regulator in the fan, which remedies all difficulties in bad cleaning, blowing grain in the chaff in high speed or irregular draught, which cannot be avoided in cleaning grain by hand power.

This Machine is also more durable and less tedious to manage than any other Separator and Cleaner, or the common machine with shaker.
