

BOROUGH ORDINANCE, No. 20.

WHEREAS, by an act of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, passed the 15th day of April, A. D., 1852, extending the provisions of the act regulating boroughs, passed the 3d day of April, A. D., 1861 to the Borough of Waynesboro, therefore to it is ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Waynesboro, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the 20th day of April, A. D., 1864, That all Fire Wood brought into the Borough of Waynesboro, shall be sold by the cord and fractions of a cord, and for that purpose there shall be a Wood Corder and Inspector appointed by the Town Council...

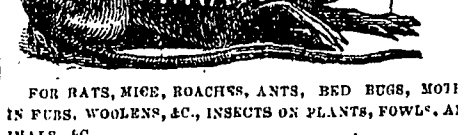
