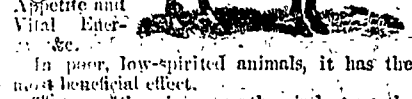

BOROUGH ORDINANCE, NO. 21. BE it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Waynesboro' and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the 15th day of December, A. D. 1864, from the curb inward one-half of the width of every pavement along the streets of said Borough (except those along Main street, already provided for) shall be kept open and unobstructed. And any person or persons who by placing any matter or thing on said space to be kept clear and unobstructed, or by carrying on any business whatsoever, thereon; or who in any way or manner shall impede the free and proper use thereof, shall upon conviction, forfeit and pay for the use of said Borough such sum (not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars) as the Chief Burgess may determine. Provided nevertheless, That any person or persons obstructing said space to be kept open as aforesaid, by but heing thereon, shall upon conviction, forfeit and pay for the use of said Borough, for the first offence the sum of five dollars, and for each and every offence thereafter the sum of ten dollars.
