

It delivers the straw fifteen feet from the reeder, or if desired, can deliver the straw and chaff together; will thresh and clean, in good grain, ready for market, from 190 to 175 bushels of wheat, or from 300 to 500 bushels of oats per day, using four or six horses, and the same number of hands; but to force the work, under most favorable circumstances, good grain, &c., will thresh and clean considerably more. 
