Those who are fond of eating strawberries when the season is here should not fail to prepare as much ground as they can spare for that purpose, then purchase plants of D. D. Fahrney of this place. Persons at a distance can enclose \$5 in a letter and receive 100 plants by return mail. Berries, exhibited at the store of W. A. Reid, weighed 3/4 ounce each!—32 to the pound. Better berries can be had nowhere. A piece 60x70 feet produced some 3 bushels of berries for first crop. They should be planted from 18 to 24 inches apart. Will return investment in one year.
