

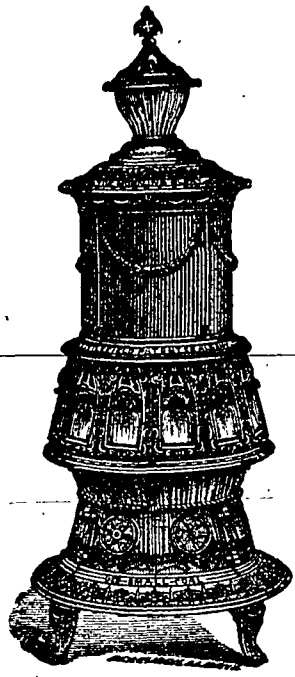

(No cinder will remain in these stoves, nor will there be any trouble from cinders or other impurities in the coal, the fire being always at the base of the coal, the impurities are left in the ashes and ground out by the "Miller.")

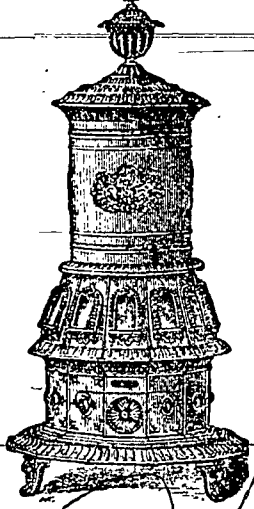
