THE LITERARY SOCIETY .- Labor, its dignity and uses, was the subject of an interesting lecture delivered before the Society on Monday evening last, by Capt. S. S. Rathvon, of Laucaster .-The subject was treated with much ability, and gave great satisfaction to the numerous audience that attended on the occasion. At the close the usual discussion took place. Dr. Cameron maintained that while all legitimate labor was honorable that connected with Agriculture was pre-eminently so-that as Agriculture improved, every thing else improved with it, that Horticulture which was a more concentrated form of Agriculture exercised a like beneficial influence, and that the community around Marietta were indebted to the Messre. A.B. Grosh briefly reviewed the lecture, and acknowledged the obligations of the meeting to Captain R., for the rich intellectual treat, with which every one present was so very well satisfied. He reminded the audience that Capt. Rathvon was one of themselves, that he was a self made mun, and that his attainments in literature and science, were probably, in some respects, unsurpassed by those of any in the State. Mr. G. Jun remarked further, that Capt. R. was one of whom the citizens of Marietta might justly feel proud, that he was glad to see so large an attendance, and to have the assurance that the 'lecture of the evening would, unquestionably, be regarded by all who heard it, as an additional testimonial to the merits of our distinguished townsman.
