ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT

Every day, there are probably 20 different people wrestling with the same problem—and, somewhere, a 21st who solved it five years ago.

The 20 waste time and money duplicating the effort of the one. A state Department of Commerce service—the Technical Assistance Program—has helped cut such waste substantially during its 10 years on the job. This program is a vital part of Commerce's science and technology effort to aid Pennsylvania business and industry.

PennTAP, as it is called, is free. By supplying technical information PennTAP keeps business, industry, and government from continually re-inventing the wheel. All a man with a problem has to do is use his telephone.

Specialist On Call

He dials the nearest Pennsylvania State University branch, and asks for the Continuing Education Office. He says he has a PennTAP inquiry, and leaves his number. PennTAP then calls him back, determines the problem, and a specialist in that field is put on the line.

Usually the PennTAP man—a Penn State faculty member—is able to fish the answer out of the library. It has a billion pages worth of information

from hard-bound technical volumes, from trade and scientific magazines, from special research reports. But if the PennTAP man can't find what he needs, he goes to the experts themselves for the answer. Few of last year's 1,600 questions went unanswered.

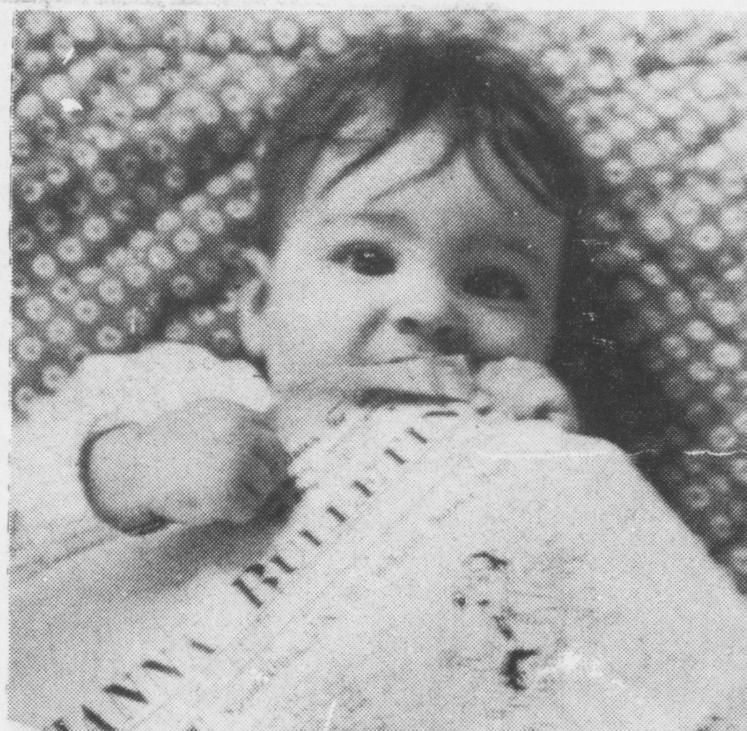
Smaller Firms Profit

PennTAP is especially valuable to smaller firms without the money or the staff to do research. They're saved from making blunders, and wasting dollars they can ill-afford. In the same way, local governments save tax money by using PennTAP's warehouse of special data.

Too, a specific inquiry can often lead to other, even more valuable, information.

One company, for example, had a good idea for a new product. But in checking out a few technical questions with PennTAP, the owner learned several larger firms were just about to start manufacturing the same type of device he'd hoped to make. That information saved him from entering a field in which he simply couldn't compete successfully. And it quite possibly saved his firm from bankruptcy—and his workers from the unemployment line.
