Justice Raymond B. Knorr, Mount Joy, announces that applications forms for reduced registration fees for motor vehicles for senior citizens will be available in his office after January 20th.

The provisions of Section 702 of the Vehicle Code of PA Bureau of Motor Vehicles has recently been amended, making these reduced registration fees available to retired persons

with incomes not exceeding \$7,500, and removing operator restrictions.

Formerly, the income figure was \$3,500, and the person registering the vehicle had to be the driver of the vehicle.
