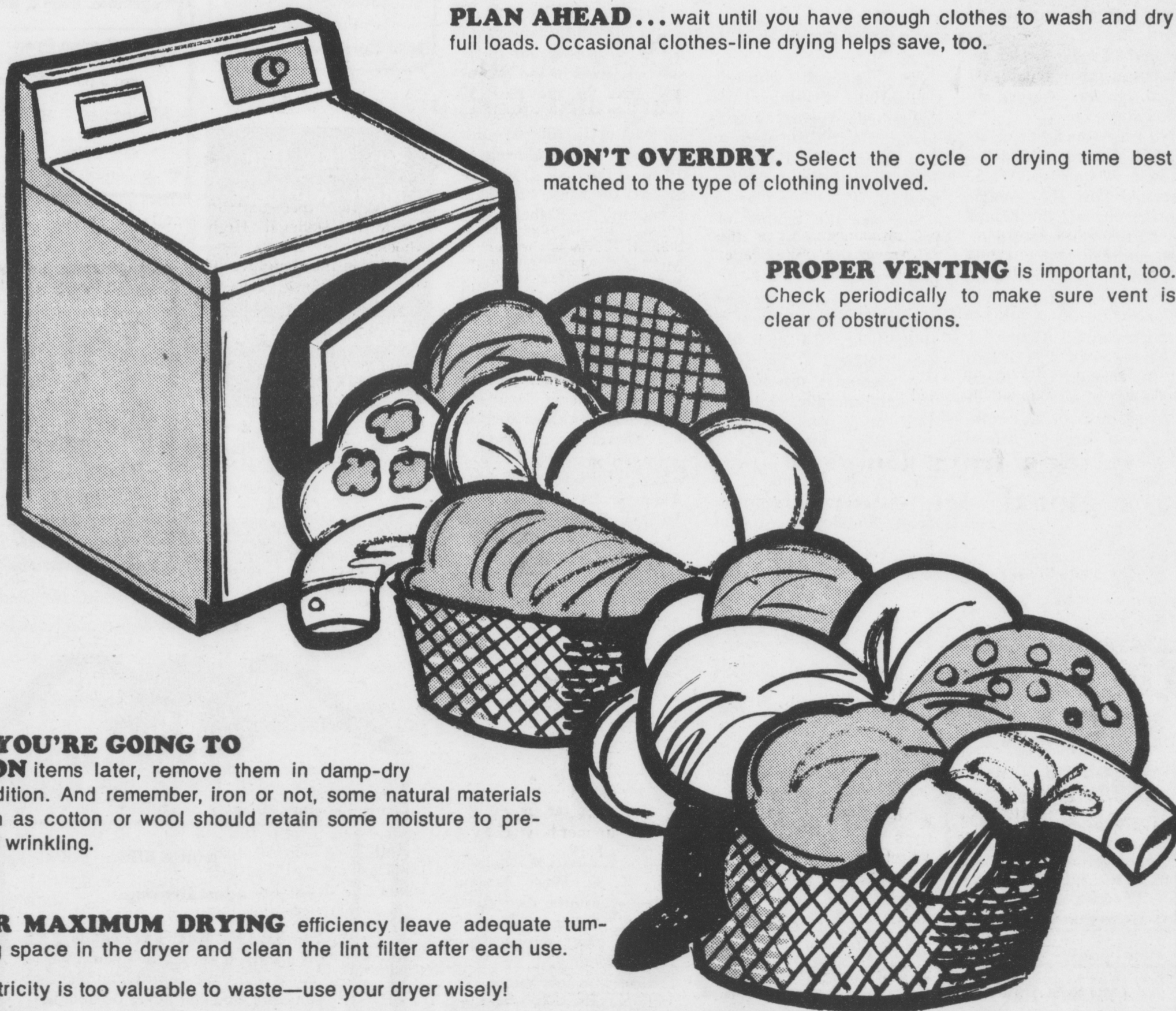

**How to save ELECTRICITY**  
**If you own a clothes dryer...**



**PLAN AHEAD...** wait until you have enough clothes to wash and dry full loads. Occasional clothes-line drying helps save, too.

**DON'T OVERDRY.** Select the cycle or drying time best matched to the type of clothing involved.

**PROPER VENTING** is important, too. Check periodically to make sure vent is clear of obstructions.
