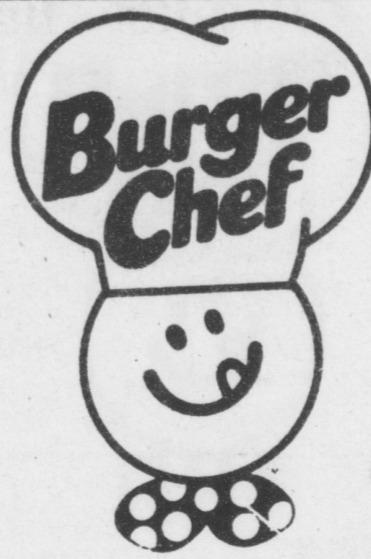
### KATHRYN M. DOUGLAS

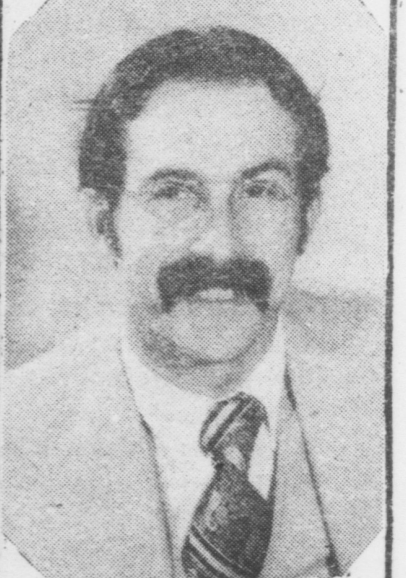
