REV. & MRS. ANTHONY SORBO

by Hazel Baker Rev. & Mrs. Anthony Sorbo, Assembly of God Missionaries to Indonesia will be guest speakers Thursday, February 19, at 7:30 p.m., in the Marietta Assembly of God Church

Waterford Avenue. An appointed missionary since 1960, the Rev. Sorbo has been the Director of Publications for the Assemblies of God in Indonesia since 1965. This work was inaugurated and established under Mr. Sorbo's direction.

Mrs. Sorbo has been National Director of Sunday Schools during this same period. In this capacity she was responsible for the publicaton of Church School Literature and leadership of over 300 Sunday Schools throughout Indonesia.

During the last four-year term the Assembly of God Publishing House has enjoyed a rapid growth. Under Mr. Sorbo's leadership two buildings were erected within the space of three years to house a new print shop and a distribution center. Several large pieces of printing equipment were also added. A staff of 30 Indonesians are now producing Sunday school and other churchrelated materials. Christian books for general reading and study, as well as materials for evangelism outreach and correspondence courses. Rev. & Mrs. Sorbo will be showing an audio-visual presentation of their work as well as telling of the challenge of Christian Missions in Indonesia today. The Rev. E.
