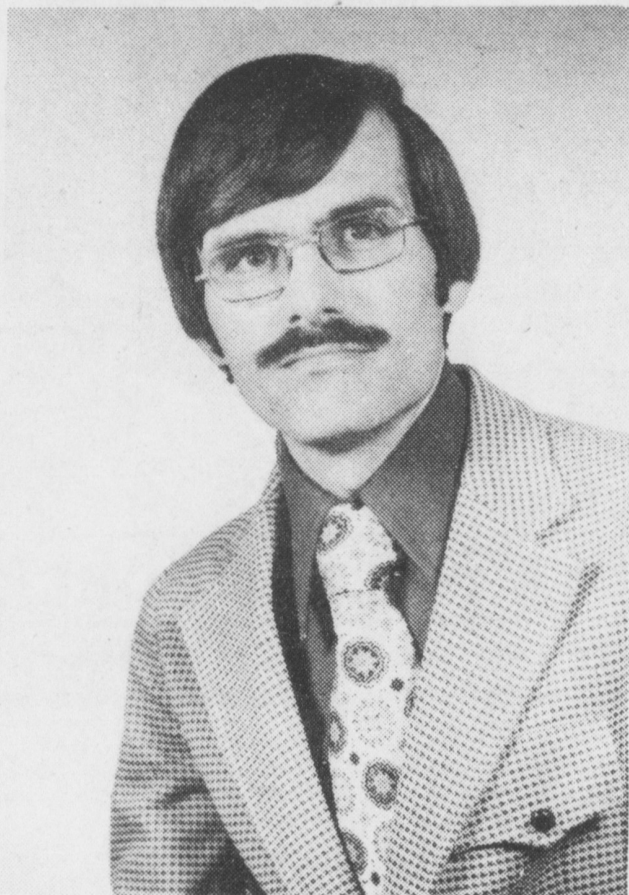


Starr named to board of Union National Bank
