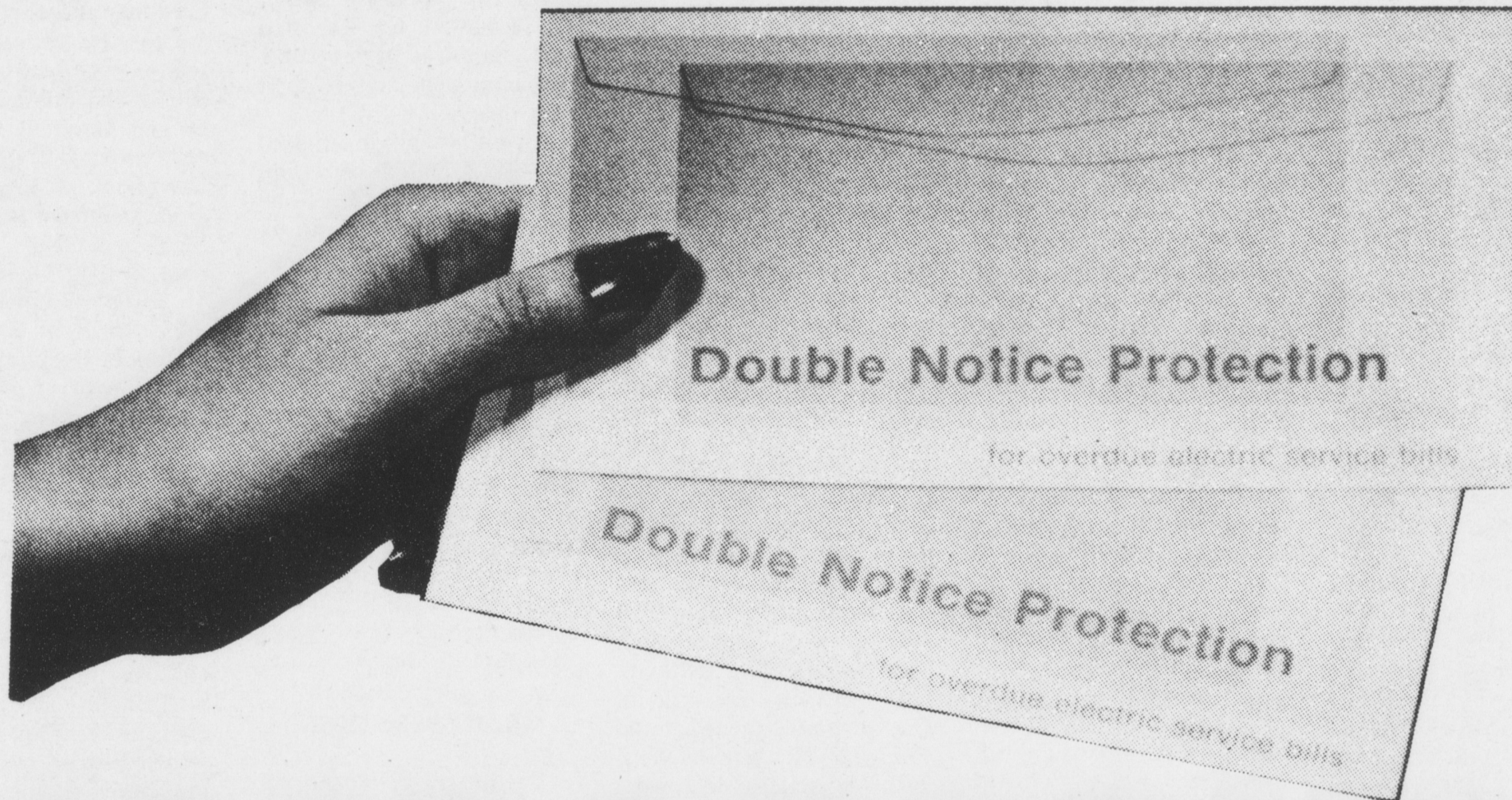
There will be workshops for the girls in make-up, acting and improvisation, costuming, stage crew, music, dance, photography and television.
